How To

Recipes

INGREDIENTS

Crust

- 1 package of oreo cookies
- 6 tablespoons of unsalted butter (melted)

Filling

- 9 oz. of fresh strawberries
- ½ cup of sweetened coconut flakes
- 6 oz. of semisweet chocolate chips
- 6 oz. of bittersweet chocolate chips
- l cup of unsweetened coconut milk
- 1 teaspoon of pure vanilla extract

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Chop the strawberries into small, bite-sized pieces and combine them with sweetened coconut flakes. (Chopping the strawberries will make it easier to cut the tart later on.)
- 2. Set aside.
- 3. In a food processor, pulse the oreo cookies to fine crumbs, and mix them with melted butter.
- 4. Evenly press the crumb mixture into nine-inch tart pan.
- 5. Refrigerate while making the ganache.
- 6. In a small saucepan, bring the coconut milk to a simmer, remove from heat, and pour it over the chocolate chips to make the ganache.
- 7. Let it sit undisturbed for at least two minutes, then whisk the mixture until smooth. (If for some reason, you still have solid chocolate pieces and the mixture is cooled too much, simply heat it in a double boiler over simmering water until completely smooth.)
- 8. Reserve about ½ of the strawberry mixture for later and spread the remaining mixture evenly on the tart crust.
- 9. Then, pour the ganache.
- 10. Refrigerate for at least two hours (to set).

- 11. Before serving, decorate the top of the tart with the reserved strawberry mixture.
- 12. Serve tart chilled.

Tip: Store the tart in the refrigerator for up to three days. Make sure it's covered!

Crafty Corner

What You Need:

- 🖵 mason jar
- □ heart stickers
- pink spray paint (matte finish)
- clear spray paint (matte finish)
- 🖵 ribbon
- 🖵 trim
- □ tea light candle or fairy lights
- □ scrapbooking paper

Instructions:

- 1. Place the heart stickers around the jar.
- 2. Spray-paint the jar with the pink spray paint.
- 3. Carefully peel off the stickers, and if the paint chips off, paint some on with a brush.
- 4. Seal it with the clear spray paint (this helps prevent chipping).
- 5. Get ribbon and other trims to tie around the rim of the jar for decoration
- 6. Finish the jar by putting fairy lights or a tea light inside (for a cute light fixture).
- 7. If you want to add decorations, add paper flowers and maybe a love note.
