

How To...

Recipes

To get us in the Halloween mood, we have two delicious and spooky recipes to start our Halloween season! First, we have fluffy Pumpkin pancakes followed by adorable allergy-free mummy cookies.

Pumpkin Pancakes

Ingredients:

- 2 eggs
- 1 ½ cups of buttermilk
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted
- 5 tablespoons canned pumpkin
- 4 cup granulated sugar
- ‡ teaspoon salt
- 1 ½ cup all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- ‡ teaspoon allspice
- A few drops of orange gel food coloring (optional)
- Add chocolate chips or nuts of your choice (optional)

To make the pancakes ...

- Preheat a skillet over medium heat. Coat the pan with a non-stick spray.
- Combine buttermilk, eggs, pumpkin, salt, sugar, and butter in a large bowl.
- Use a mixer to blend the ingredients.
- Add dry ingredients to wet ingredients and blend together with the mixer until smooth.
- Add a couple of drops of food coloring gel until you get a nice orange.
 (optional)
- Pour/scoop the batter onto the hot skillet, using ½ cup for each pancake.
- When the batter is done bubbling and edges start to harden, flip the pancakes. They should be golden brown. This will take one to two minutes.
- Flip the pancakes and cook the other side for the same amount of time until golden brown.

Mummy Cookies

Ingredients:

- \(\frac{3}{4}\) cup semi-sweet chocolate chips and a few additional for eyes (I, personally, used Enjoy Life Mini Chips for this recipe)
- ½ tablespoon coconut oil or non-hydrogenated shortening
- 12 allergy-friendly crunchy sugar cookies (I used 1 box of Enjoy Life Sugar Crisp Crunchy Cookies, but any sugar cookies should be fine)
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 4 teaspoons unsweetened dairy-free milk beverage (I used coconut milk, but almond milk works samilarly)
- \(\frac{1}{4}\) teaspoon vanilla extract

How to make the cookies ...

- 1. Melt the chocolate chips with the oil or shortening. Then put them in a bowl and whisk until smooth.
- 2. Take the cookies and drench them in the chocolate chip mixture drip. Put the excess back into the bowl. Let them dry (I put them on a wire rack).
- 3. Place the cookies in the refrigerator while you make the icing to coat the cookies with.
- 4. Drizzle vanilla or powdered sugar into a mixin gbowl.
- 5. Add milk to the bowl (teaspoon by teaspoon). The amount you add will vary. You could probably use anywhere from two to four teaspoons. For reference: I use around three and a half teaspoons.
- 6. Place the mixture icing in something with a narrow opening for decorating the cookies. I went old-fashioned and used a plastic bag with a hole in the corner of the bag for my cookies.
- 7. Take the cookies from the refrigerator once the chocolate is set. It took mine around half an hour to become ready.
- 8. Decorate! I used two dots for the eyes and a straight line for the mouth, but feel free to get creative here. Don't forget the mummy bandages to give a Halloween feel!
- 9. You're done! Store these in a single layer container (or, for travel, place parchment paper in between each layer).
- 10. Finally, serve and enjoy!






1. Print out the skull printable pictured above. Cut out and glue together as instructed. To easily cut the eyes and nose out, fold that section and cut a slit.

- 2. Draw a desired pattern on the mask with markers and/or pencils. If you want, you can use printables, too.
- 3. Print out the flower printable on colored paper OR color on white paper.
- 4. Cut out the flowers on the plain line.
- 5. Use a glue stick to glue the flowers together (number three on two on one).
- 6. Then, glue the arrangement of flowers onto the mask and tie some strings to hold the mask on your face.

Halloween Lanterns

What you'll need ...

- One mason jar
- Printer
- Paper
- Orange paint
- Paintbrush
- Glue
- LED candle

First, you will want to find the silhouette image of the character you want to print out. This can be a monster, a ghost, a pumpkin, a bat, or anything else you can come up with. Then, you'll want to print it out and cut around the outside of the

Audience: Middle Grade (MG)

After being saved by two mysterious princes, she is whisked off to the Kingdom Beyond, a giant world that houses all sorts of creatures, people, and monsters from Indian mythology.
