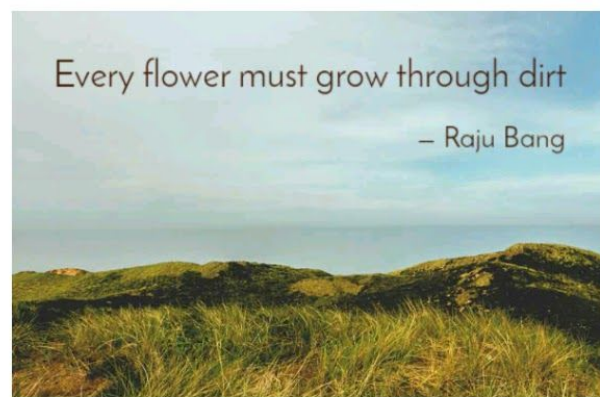
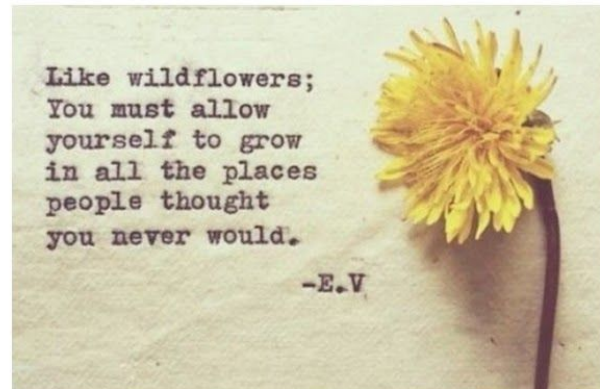
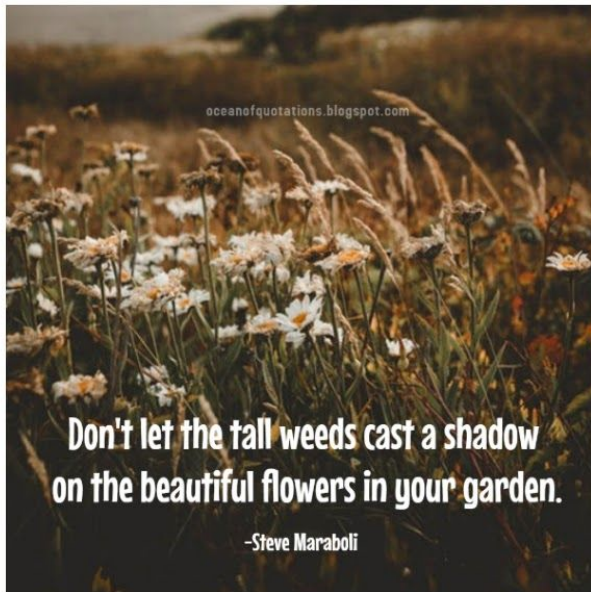

Crafty Corner

How to Make a Galaxy Jar

Supplies:

- a mason jar
- cotton balls
- acrylic paint
- glitter
- glue

Instructions:

1. Mix each color separately with water.
2. Stretch out the cotton balls and place them at the bottom of the jar to make a one-inch layer.
3. Pour one of the colors on the layer and sprinkle glitter on the outside so you can see it.
4. Repeat steps two and three until the jar is filled.
5. Once the jar is filled, glue on the cap of the jar so the water does not leak.
