

Recipes

Pumpkin Cheesecake Swirl Bread

Cheesecake Swirl

- 18-oz. package cream cheese (at room temperature)
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- llarge egg

Pumpkin Bread

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup pumpkin puree
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- llarge egg

To make the cheesecake swirl ...

 Position an oven rack in the bottom part of the oven. Preheat oven to 325 degrees Fahrenheit. Combine the cream cheese, granulated sugar, sour cream, and egg in a large bowl and beat with a mixer until well combined. Then set aside.

To make the pumpkin bread...

- 1. Spray a 9x5-inch loaf pan with nonstick spray and dust with flour. Whisk together granulated sugar and pumpkin puree in a large bowl, then whisk in the oil, pumpkin pie spice, vanilla, and egg. Whisk in the flour mixture until combined.
- 2. Reserve 1 cup of the pumpkin batter. Spread the remaining batter in the bottom of prepared loaf pan. Spoon the cream cheese mixture over the pumpkin batter, then put the reserved cup of pumpkin batter in a line down the center of the pan. Insert the tip of a paring knife into the batter and drag it through and up to swirl five to six times.
- 3. Bake until the top is cracked and a cake tester inserted in the center comes out clean (1 hour 15 minutes to 1 hour 20 minutes). Cool on a wire rack for 30 minutes, then carefully transfer onto a platter or cake stand and flip upright. Let cool completely (at least 1 1/2 hours).

Maple Apple Crisp

(gluten free, dairy free, peanut free)

Ingredients:

- 4 cups cored + sliced tart green apples (I used 4-5 apples)
- 2 tablespoons healthy, soy-free margarine
- l tablespoon pure maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- l cup gluten-free quick oats
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons soy-free margarine (Earth Balance or coconut oil), melted
- 1/4 cup pure maple syrup

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Lightly oil a 9x9-inch square baking dish and put aside for later.

- Make the filling ...

- 3. Cut the apples in half, core them, and slice thinly. You should have about 4 cups. I don't peel the apples since the peel adds fiber, but you can peel your apples first if you like.
- 4. Place the apples in a large bowl and add in the cinnamon and nutmeg until thoroughly coated.
- 5. Add maple syrup, melted margarine or coconut oil, cinnamon, and nutmeg, and mix to coat the apples thoroughly.
- 6. Spread the apple mixture in the bottom of the prepared dish and set aside.

- Prepare the crisp topping...

- 7. Using a medium-sized bowl, toss the gluten-free quick oats with cinnamon and salt
- 8. Add melted margarine or coconut oil and maple syrup. Mix well. Sprinkle the oats on top of the apples.
- 9. Bake for 45-50 minutes (or until the apples are soft). Allow to cool for about 10 minutes before serving.
- 10. Enjoy!

Crafty Corner

Making a Kumihimo...


What You Need:

- Two colors of yarn
- □ Thin cardboard circle (you can use a cereal box) with a 4-6 inch diameter

How To:

- Mark the north, east, west, and south points of the circle and cut a 1/2 inch slit at each of these marks. Then, cut a slit in between those slits so you have eight. In the middle of those slits, cut more until you have sixteen evenly-split slits.
- 2. Cut two pieces of yarn the length of your arm in both colors (you should have four pieces).
- 3. Gather all the pieces of yarn and fold them in half, knotting them in a loop knot so that you have eight equal lengths of string.
- 4. Push the knot through a hole in the center of the cardboard circle. Position the first color string on north and south, and put the other color next to it. Do the same for the second color except for east and west.
- 5. Make sure the first color string (north) is on the right. Bring it down to the right (south), and make a quarter turn. Keep repeating this until the bracelet fits your wrist.
- 6. Then, pull the extra string through the loop. Knot it, and cut off the extra string.


